Dear Director:

On behalf of the 1,100 licensed hearing professionals in New Jersey, I respectfully request that the Department of Veterans Affairs change its current status of hearing aid specialists, so they are given access to care for our nationous veterans.

Currently, VA clinics are permitted to contract with hearing aid specialists when the clinics cannot fill the need for services, however, only state licensed audiologists are permitted to perform the hearing evaluations. With a backlog of hundreds of thousands of Veterans in need of service-related disabilities, including hearing loss and tinnitus, licensed hearing aid specialists have the expertise and training to help. It does not make sense to cut-off these credentialed health professionals who in many ways can help with access since they often service rural areas and perform home visits.

In New Jersey, dispensers must have a minimum of an associate¢s degree in hearing aid selection and fitting; proof of completion of a minimum of six months continuous training within a 24-month period; and have passed a written and practicum state licensing exam. They are more than qualified to provide the necessary comprehensive hearing evaluations and should be given the access to care for our veterans. A change in policy is in the best interest of the health and wellness of our country¢s heroes.
